A SHORT HISTORY OF THE CLUB

1961: The Lane Cove Country Club was founded in 1961 to create a golf course and bowling greens in a bushland setting. James White was the foundation President with Arch McKinnon as Secretary.

1964: The Clubhouse was opened on July 25th, with a short golf course of 9 holes of the pitch and putt variety south of Richardson St. as well as the first bowling green.

1967: Official opening of the course on May 13th, 1967 with further development to create 9 holes par 32. Subsequently two additional greens were created and the sixth hole repositioned.

1983: Lane Cove Municipal Council took over management of the golf course with members allocated block playing times and paying green fees to the Council.

2005: Lane Cove Council Golf Course Management Advisory Committee was formed. The object of this Committee was to assist Council in improving the golf course to Benchmark Standard based on recognised best practice in the golf industry. Two Club representatives are on this Committee.

GENERAL RULES OF CLUB

RULES

Every Member should acquire a proper knowledge of the "Official Rules of Golf" and also local rules. Simple breaches can incur disqualification. Members who have problems relating to rule interpretations are invited to discuss them with the Captain or Members of the Match Committee.

CANCELLATIONS

Please notify your partner and Pro. Shop - 9428 1316.

CARDS

Make sure that your stroke score for each hole is correctly recorded and your card is signed or disqualification will result. Enter your handicap and your golf link number on your card before commencing to play.

NOTICES

Please observe the Notice Board. **You are deemed to be notified immediately a notice appears on the board.**

The conditions governing play in all major events will be placed on the Starter's Board - Members are obliged to make themselves familiar with these conditions.

PRIORITY OF THE COURSE

Pairs, Threesomes and Foursomes shall have precedence over and be entitled to pass any other kind of match. A single player has no standing, and should give way to a match of any kind.

Any match playing a whole round is entitled to pass a match playing a shorter round.

If a match fails to keep its place on the course and lose more than one clear hole on the players in front, it should allow the match following to pass.

All players are expected to know and observe the etiquette and rules of golf. It is the duty and responsibility of the lowest handicapped player in the match to see that his fellow competitors replace all divots, smooth out all footmarks in bunkers and observe the etiquette and rules of the game.

GENERAL RULES (Cont.)

PROTESTS

Any competitor desiring to enter a protest in connection with a match or competition shall do so in writing addressed to the Secretary and handed to the Secretary or Match Committee Member immediately on completion of the competitor's round.

Protests will be considered by the Match Committee at the earliest opportunity and their decision shall be final.

FIXTURES

The nature of a competition set down for a particular day may be altered by the Match Committee without notice, but where possible due notice shall be given.

DRESS REGULATIONS DURING GOLF COMPETITIONS

MEN

Permitted:

- Collared golf shirt to be worn at all times and tucked in.
- Trousers or shorts must be worn with belt and have a fly.
- White socks only to be worn with golf shoes when wearing shorts.

Not Permitted:

- No offensive language is allowed on any clothing.
- No Jeans or denim shorts.
- No singlets.
- No tracksuits.

WOMEN

Permitted:

- Skirts or culottes, tailored slacks, shorts or $\frac{3}{4}$ pants.
- Golf shirts must have a collar and be tucked in unless suitably finished with a band or slits at the side.

Not Permitted:

- Jeans, singlet tops, midriff tops, tracksuits.

GOLF COMPETITIONS AND HOW THEY ARE PLAYED

These notes are only intended to assist in the general concept of how various competitions are played. They must be read in conjunction with the Rules of Golf and in particular the Committee shall lay down the conditions under which a competition is to be played (Rule 36-1).

STROKE (MEDAL)

The score at each hole is entered on the score card, totalled and the player's full handicap deducted. The player who completes the stipulated round in the fewest strokes will be the winner.

PAR

In Par play the score is entered on the card in the same way as in stroke play with the exception that where the score exceeds par for the hole, after allowing for handicap stroke (if the player is in receipt of one) the score need not be written in.

It is the custom that when a player is beaten by Par, the ball shall be picked up. This helps speed up play.

After entering the stroke score on the card, the result is marked in the column provided with a "+" sign for a win, and "O" for a half and "-" for a loss. At the end of the round the plus and minus signs are added and the nett result written in as so many "up", "down" or "all Square".

STABLEFORD

This system of scoring by points was introduced by Dr. Stableford of the Liverpool Golf Club in 1931 and has become very popular. The popular method of playing a Stableford competition is for the player to take strokes at holes as in a Par competition using full handicap and to score points on the nett results at each hole. At the end of the round all points scored are added up and the player having the highest number of points is the winner.

In scoring, with allowance for handicaps, a player who scores par receives 2 points; for 1 over par, 1 point; for a birdie or one under par, 3 points; for an eagle or 2 under par, 4 points; and so on.

GOLF COMPETITIONS AND HOW THEY ARE PLAYED (cont.)

TWO BALL BEST BALL v. PAR.

Two players play as partners each taking strokes at holes as in a par competition. If one of the partners wins a hole and the other halves it only the win is counted. If one halves a hole with par and the other loses it, only the half is counted and so on. Plus, half and minus signs are added at the end of the round and recorded as in ordinary par competition.

In a two ball handicap event care must be taken to mark the scores of each player in separate columns headed by the initials of the player. If the scores are mixed and it is impossible for the Committee to check the card the players will be disqualified.

TWO BALL BEST BALL STABLEFORD

Played in exactly the same manner as above except that the better ball of the partnership will be credited with points instead of plus, half or minus.

FOURSOMES

Two players play as partners and use one ball. The partners strike off alternately from the tee and thereafter strike the ball alternately during the play at each hole. Scoring is done as for a stroke round and the total is subject to a deduction of half the partners' aggregate handicaps.

CANADIAN FOURSOMES

Played as above except that both players play tee shots at every hole and afterwards continue with whichever ball they nominate.

AMBROSE

This game is usually played with four players, although two or three can participate as a team. All players play tee shots at each hole. One ball is selected and each player plays from this position. Again the best ball is selected and the procedure is repeated until the ball is holed. Handicap is gained from the aggregate of all player's handicaps, dividing by eight for four players, six for three players and four for two players.

Four Ball Ambrose. Each player must use three tee shots.

Three Ball Ambrose. Each player must use four tee shots.

Two Ball Ambrose. Each player must use six tee shots.

GOLF COMPETITIONS AND HOW THEY ARE PLAYED (cont.)

PAR BISQUE

Disregard handicap rating on the score cards. The player decides at which hole he wishes to use strokes off his allocated handicap. The decision must be made at each hole when played or before teeing off at the next hole. The score card will show:

First column, the number of strokes taken.

Second column, the number of strokes the player decides to take from his handicap.

Third column, the result, recorded as + or -.

STABLEFORD (3 & 4)

Play in conjunction with single Stableford with two players comprising a team. One member of the team is nominated before teeing off as the person whose score will be taken on the Par 3 holes to count towards the team score. The other team member's score will be taken on the Par 4 holes to count towards the team score. The other team member's score will be taken on the Par 4 holes to count towards the team score.

CANADIAN 2 STROKE

Handicap is 3/8ths of combined handicap. Both players hit a tee shot and then strike their ball a second time. The best ball position is then selected. If the position of Player A's ball is chosen, then Player B's ball picked up. Then Player B strikes the chosen ball. They then have alternate shots with the one ball until it is holed.

MEN'S NOTICES

GRADES

Three monthly Medals will be played for in all Medal stroke rounds.
The grades will be from 0 - 12; 13 - 19; 20 - 36.

HANDICAP TABLE

MATCH: Full difference between the respective handicaps.

PAR & STABLEFORD: Full handicap.

FOUR BALL MATCH: The lowest marker to play from Scratch. The rest to take FULL difference between their respective handicaps.

FOURSOMES MATCH: 1/2 of difference of combined handicaps (1/2 stroke equals 1 stroke).

FOURSOMES STROKE: 1/2 of combined handicaps (show 1/2 strokes)

CANADIAN FOURSOMES STROKE: 1/2 of combined handicaps (show 1/2 strokes).

MEN'S COMPETITIONS - CONDITIONS OF PLAY

Juniors shall be eligible for all events, unless otherwise notified by the Committee. To be eligible to play in any of the events specified below, (except for the Eclectic and "Other Events"), members must have a full handicap at the time of commencement of the event.

FORFEITS

All events must be played on or before the date specified by the Committee. Forfeits could result in sanctions being applied by the Committee. Substitutions may apply in the event of a forfeit.

CLUB CHAMPIONSHIP

The format of the Club Championships alternates each year between 4 rounds of Stroke and 2 rounds of Stroke followed by the top 8 qualifiers in each playing singles Matchplay in each grade.

Play: Stroke – 4 rounds of aggregate stroke. The Committee has decided that No Cut will apply.

Ties: Playoff over multiples of 18 holes as necessary at a time to be set by the Committee.

Play: Matchplay Format – 2 rounds of aggregate stroke to qualify. Then the top 8 in each Grade proceed to the Matchplay rounds. Countback applies if necessary to decide top 8. If required to decide the 8th position, a blind draw will be used

Ties: Continue until the match is decided. Return to the first Hole and continue playing each hole in the normal order until the Match is decided.

Grades: Club Championship: All eligible
A Grade 0-12
B Grade 13-19
C Grade 20-27

FOURSOMES CHAMPIONSHIP

The format of the Foursomes Championships alternates each year between 2 rounds of Stroke and 1 round of Stroke followed by the top 4 qualifiers in each Grade playing Matchplay.

Play: Scratch Stroke – 2 rounds of aggregate stroke. The Committee has decided that No Cut will apply.

Ties: Playoff over multiples of 18 holes as necessary at a time to be set by the Committee.

Play: Matchplay Format – 1 round of aggregate stroke to qualify. Then the top 4 in each Grade proceed to the Matchplay rounds. 1 vs 4 and 2 vs 3. Countback applies if necessary to decide top 4. If required to decide the 4th position, a blind draw will be used

Ties: Continue until the match is decided. Return to the first Hole and continue playing each hole in the normal order until the Match is decided.

Grades: Foursomes Championship: All eligible

A Grade 0-12

B Grade 13-19

C Grade 20-27

NB If players are from different grades they can only play in the lowest markers grade.

MIDWEEK CHAMPIONSHIP

Play: Aggregate of three (3) rounds of singles Stableford

Ties: Count back commencing with the 3rd card

Handicap Limit: 27

MIXED FOURSOMES CHAMPIONSHIP & COL BUDDLE TROPHY

Play: Mixed Foursomes Championship – scratch stroke over 36 holes

Col Buddle Trophy – Net stroke in conjunction

Ties: Championship – 18 hole play off to decide champions. Runners up decided by countback if necessary.

Col Buddle –decided by countback

Handicap Limits: Men 27
Women 45

NB Winners of club championship cannot win Col Buddle Trophy.

MONTHLY MEDAL

Play: Net stroke
Grades: A grade 0-12; B Grade 13-19; C Grade 20-32
Ties: Play off over 18 holes in conjunction with the next Medal to decide winners. Runners up to be decided by countback if necessary. Handicaps current on the day of the play off are to be used.

GOLD MEDAL PLAY OFF

Play: Net stroke to be played in conjunction with the February Medal.

Eligibility: All Medal winners from the previous calendar year

Ties: Play off over 18 holes. Normally this would be in conjunction with the next monthly Medal but may be varied by the Committee if necessary. Handicaps applicable are those current at time of play off.

ECLECTIC COMPETITION

Two competitions held each year over periods specified by the Committee.

Play: Best stroke result per hole over the period of the competition. Only Saturday scores where there is an individual competition are eligible. Match play scores are not acceptable.

Entries must be dated and signed by marker.

Handicaps: Half the handicap current on the last day of the period of the competition.

Handicap Limit: 36

OTHER EVENTS

Play: As shown in the Fixture Book

Handicaps: Members: 36

Ties: Countback

MATCH PLAY EVENTS

In handicap match play events such as the Singles Knockout and the 2BBB Knockout, strokes are to be taken in accordance with the Match Play Index. The lowest marker in the match is deemed to be playing off scratch (zero). The other competitors playing handicaps become the difference between the lowest markers actual handicap and their own actual handicap. The differences in handicap thus obtained are then applied against the Match Play Index to determine at which hole strokes are to be given/obtained.

Ties: Matches all square after 18 holes shall be played off hole by hole from the 1st hole until one player or team wins a hole. Strokes are to be taken as in the original 18 holes.

Unless informed other wise by the Committee, play off holes **MUST** be played in score card order.

In order to maintain the pace of play, it would be appreciated if players leave the course when a match has been completed.

SLOW PLAY

The regular occurrence of “Slow Play” is discussed consistently among members, and with the thought that almost every player-member of the Club has at some time expressed concern about the effects of Slow Play on their enjoyment of the game, we publish the following ten suggestions which could be of assistance in overcoming the problem.

1. Not being ready on time.
Select club and ball while other players are having their shots.
2. Delays on tees or greens while marking the card.
Always mark the card while awaiting your turn at the next tee.
3. Players wait with others on the tee until all have played their shot, then walk to their own ball.
Walk directly to your own ball, or level with same; and select club to be used while awaiting for others to play their shots.
4. Unnecessary number of practice swings.
It is agreed that each player has his own preference in this matter, but practice swings should be limited by discretion.

-
5. Delays in locating lost balls.
If, after a reasonable period, it is apparent you are holding up play, call next group through.
 6. Lack of discretion in going through a team that has lost a ball.
If called ahead as in (5) but immediately afterwards the team ahead locate their ball and it is evident that play will proceed faster if they continue; you should signal to them to go ahead.
Note: The discretion is in the hands of the team called through and not the players who were looking for the lost ball.
 7. On the putting green unnecessary marking of balls and players not continuing to putt out.
On reaching the green and your ball, study the line of your putt immediately. When it is your turn to putt, try and wherever possible to putt right out. Marking the ball may not be necessary after every putt.
 8. Players not using the time on the green, while waiting their turn, to assess their own putt.
Whenever possible, a player should have assessed his own putt for direction and speed while the other players are putting, providing doing so, no interference is caused to the other players.
 9. Incorrect handling of the flag, on the green.
The player nearest the hole should attend the flag and then pass to the first player to hole out, then appraise his own putt.
 10. Leaving buggies around the green on the wrong side of the tee.
Always place your buggy adjacent to the approach to the next tee.

BY FAR THE MOST IMPORTANT RULE IS BRIEF

Each player walks directly to or adjacent to his ball at all times, and waits there for the player farthest from the hole to play his shot.

He should use that time to assess his own shot.

We ask you to get into the habit of playing this way, and if you see anybody NOT playing this way, this is why you are having a slow round.

WOMEN'S NOTICES

TROPHY DONATIONS

It is a regulation of this section that all women members donate \$35.00 towards trophy costs. Your committee express their thanks for the unanimous support given to this regulation.

CHANGE OF ADDRESS

Women members are requested to notify the Secretary immediately of change of address and telephone number.

MOBILE PHONES

Mobile phones are allowed on the course but must be switched OFF and only used in case of emergency.

HANDICAP CARDS

It is the responsibility of each player to check her handicap on the Golf Link Handicap Sheets in the Pro Shop to ensure that she plays on her correct handicap. New lady golfers will gain a GA handicap after returning scores of three (3) completed 9 or 18 hole stroke rounds.

COMPETITION NOTES

Conditions of Play

A complete list of Conditions of Play for all competitions may be found on the Notice Board in the Women Members Room.

Alteration of Fixtures

The program of fixtures may be altered by the Match Committee without notice, but where possible, due notice will be given.

The Nominated Day

At the beginning of the year, all women members must confirm their main playing day for major trophies, ie Thursday (Midweek) or Sunday. Should a member wish to change her nominated day, a letter of request must be sent to the Committee requesting same.

Tuesday Competition

18 Hole Tuesday Competition starts after the Opening Dinner.

Draw for Competition

Draws will be done for Tuesday, Thursday and Sunday games.

Tee-off time

Players should be at the tee fifteen(15) minutes before their tee-off time. Players who are late and miss their tee-off time will be directed by the Starter. Failing that they must go to the end of the field.

Team Events

Players are responsible for informing partners if they are unable to play in a scheduled game.

Scratch and Nett Trophies

There will be Scratch and Nett winners in major competitions. However, players may not win Scratch and Nett Trophies in the same major trophy event.

Ties in Competitions: Countback

Ties will be decided by countback in all minor competitions.

Ties in Major Competitions: Play-off

If there is a tied result for a major trophy, there will be a play-off on the first suitable day, and, if that is tied, a countback will be used. Medal rounds will be played off on the next medal round and if that is tied, a countback will be used.

Ties in WGNSW Medal Competition

After all six (6) rounds have been completed, the best three (3) rounds are recorded as an aggregate. In the event of a tie, joint winners will be declared . Both winners will receive a medal and both will also be eligible to play in the respective Play-off for their Division.

WOMEN'S NOTICES (cont.)

COMPETITIONS

THERE MUST BE SIX (6) PLAYERS TO MAKE AN 18 HOLE COMPETITION AND THREE(3) PLAYERS TO MAKE A 9 HOLE COMPETITION, EXCEPT FOR MEDAL ROUNDS WHERE THERE CAN BE AS FEW AS ONE PLAYER TO MAKE A COMPETITION.

MEMBERS MUST BE FINANCIAL AND HAVE PAID THEIR WGNSW FEE TO BE ELIGIBLE TO COMPETE. SEPARATE COMPETITION FOR MIDWEEK AND SUNDAY.

Eclectic Competition

Scores will be taken over all single 18 and 9 hole rounds on a Thursday or a Sunday, except for match play events. Players are responsible for ensuring that their markers record their scores and sign in the book provided.

For stipulated Thursday/Sunday events, any participating player may enter eclectic or birdie details on her record. Half a player's handicap will be subtracted from the final score. The Committee will not be responsible for any omission.

WGNSW Medals

Division 1 Handicaps	0 - 22
Division 2 Handicaps	23 - 32
Division 3 Handicaps	33 - 45

Mixed Medal - for less than 4 players in a division.

The winner in each Division will be the competitor with the lowest nett aggregate for three (3) scores out of six (6) stroke rounds. Once a player has commenced in a Division, she shall remain in that Division for the duration of the six (6) WGNSW Medal rounds.

Club Brooch

Division 1 Handicaps 0-32

Division 2 Handicaps 33-45

The CLUB BROOCH is the Trophy of the Day for each Medal Round. It can only be won once and may only be won by a player on her nominated day. A MEDAL BADGE will be substituted if the winner already has won a brooch. However, if a competitor on other than her nominated day has the winning score, she will receive a Voucher for her win. This is in addition to the Brooch/Medal winner. As there are two divisions at Lane Cove Country Club, the winner of the other division will receive a badge without the word "Medal" across the top or Club spoon or fork. The Division of a player for the Club Brooch/Medal is determined by her handicap on the day.

WOMEN'S NOTICES (cont.)

Putting Competition

This is played in conjunction with the six (6) Medal Rounds, the winner in each division having the aggregate of the three best putting scores.

MAJOR COMPETITIONS

Club Championship (for handicaps 0 - 32)

Lowest aggregate scratch score from three (3) 18 hole Stroke rounds from Midweek and Sunday. Best Nett in conjunction.

Club Champion (for handicaps 0 - 32)

Lowest aggregate scratch score from Mid-week and Sunday Premiership.

B Grade Championship (for handicaps 33 – 39)

Lowest aggregate scratch score from three (3) 18 hole Stroke rounds from Midweek and Sunday. Best Nett in conjunction.

C Grade Championship (for handicaps 40 – 45)

Lowest aggregate scratch score from three (3) 18 hole Stroke rounds from Midweek and Sunday. Best Nett in conjunction.

Foursomes Championship

Lowest aggregate scratch score from two (2) 18 hole Stroke rounds from Midweek and Sunday. Best Nett in conjunction (1/2 combined handicap).

Gold Brooch

All past Club Brooch winners are eligible to compete in this Sunday Stroke round for the Gold Brooch. The Gold Brooch can only be won once. No voucher for winner if receiving brooch on Presentation Night.

WGNSW 3BBB Ladies' Team Classic

18 Hole 3BBB/Par competition for which an Entry Fee (\$5 per competitor) applies. Choice of team on nominated day. The team with best club score to compete in WGNSW zone play off.

MINOR COMPETITIONS

President's Cup

The one (1) best Nett Score to result from an 18 Hole Stroke round on a specified Sunday/Thursday. This is a Sunday/Thursday event and will be alternated each year between Sunday and Thursday. No voucher for winner, as receiving trophy on Presentation Night.

Captain's Salver

The one (1) best Stableford Score to result from a specific Sunday/Thursday

competition. The playing of this event will be alternated each year between Sunday and Thursday. No voucher for winner, as receiving trophy on Presentation Night.

Bronze I Trophy (for handicaps 0 - 32)

Best two (2) out of three (3) Stableford rounds from Midweek and Sunday.

Bronze II Trophy (for handicaps 33 - 39)

Best two (2) out of three (3) Stableford rounds from Midweek and Sunday.

Bronze III Trophy (for handicaps 40 - 45)

Best two (2) out of three (3) Stableford rounds from Midweek and Sunday.

Veterans' Cup

The best aggregate of three (3) Stableford rounds for each of Midweek and Sunday. Competitors should be financial members of VWGA.

Summer Competition

Aggregate of three (3) best 9 Hole Stableford scores played on Thursdays and Sundays between the main golf seasons. If there is a tie, there will be a countback over the last 9 holes (of the best three).

Singles Knockout - Match Play

$\frac{3}{4}$ handicap difference Match Play. The first round must be played on the starting date of the KO or player forfeits to opponent. The following rounds may be played on the specified date, or before the next round by mutual agreement. Played on Tuesdays, but open to both Thursday and Sunday players. Presentation of trophies to both Winner and Runner-up is on the final day of play. Entries close at 4.00 pm on the Tuesday before the scheduled competition commences. Entry Fee \$9.

Memorial Day Trophy

This 18 Hole Stableford event will be played on a Sunday as a combined Thursday/Sunday event.

Super Vets' Trophy

Best score of a Super Vet from a specified Stableford round for each of Midweek and Sunday.

Non Trophy Winners' Event
